The Chambers Creek Properties are open from dawn to dusk (adjusted seasonally).

Rules signs are posted around the site. Please read and follow all rules. Portions of the site will continue to remain closed for your safety.



Visiting

Parking is available along Grandview Drive and in parking areas at Central Meadow, North Meadow, and the Environmental Services Building.

There is no direct bus service to the Properties. You can take Pierce Transit Route 53 (University Place) to Grandview Drive and 40th Street West. Walk south one mile on Grandview Drive to Cirque Plaza.



Emergency

Trash

Help keep your beach clean. Please pack out your trash and dispose it in the receptacles provided.



Tides

Portions of this beach are unavailable at high tide. Remember to check the posted tidal charts to avoid being stranded.



Trains

Keep off the railroad tracks. Always use the pedestrian overpass to cross the tracks. Trains may approach without warning.

Seals and sea lions need time ashore and our shoreline is a favorite resting spot. It is against federal law to disturb or harass wildlife. People and dogs should stay at least 100 yards away.

Welcome to Pierce County's Chambers Creek Properties!

The Chambers Creek Properties are unique among public lands. Included in the 930 acres are over two miles of saltwater shoreline, two-and-a-half miles of urban creek and canyon, and breathtaking mountain and Puget Sound views. Home to gravel mining for over a century, the site was purchased by the Sewer Utility for expansion of the wastewater treatment plant

The Chambers Creek Properties Master Site Plan was developed to guide the necessary reclamation of the site. The nationally recognized redevelopment plan seeks a balance of public access, government services, and revenue generation.

Currently visitors may use the playfields and meadows, walk miles of public trails, play Chambers Bay golf course, dine at Chambers Bay Grill, and visit the award-winning Environmental Services Building and Chambers Creek Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant is currently undergoing expansion, part of which includes a new section of trail that will lead walkers past the Environmental Services Building and down to lower Chambers Creek Road. The trail opens in 2011.

In the years ahead, a permanent clubhouse, lodging and related facilities, and more restaurants will be added to the dynamic landscape.
