We are the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) for Pierce County, the Lead Entity for the Puyallup-White-Carbon and Chambers-Clover Creek Watersheds. We are one of 26 similar organizations statewide.

The CAC was created under state law - House Bill 2496. Our main job consists of recruiting salmon habitat protection and restoration projects, advising sponsors, suggesting modifications to proposed projects and finally prioritizing the projects. Field trips to project sites are coordinated in the summer.

The CAC usually meets on the first Thursday of the month at 4:00 pm at the Parkland Spanaway Library, on Pacific Avenue.

We have six years of success behind us, but now need new and energetic citizens to join us to help move this process forward.

We use a strategy document to measure each project. The projects come in many forms. Examples include: culvert replacements, assessment of the nearshore or other water bodies, land acquisitions and other salmon habitat related projects. Once the CAC has completed a prioritized list, it is sent to the State Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB) for funding consideration.



The CAC is supported by a Technical Advisory Group (TAG), made up mostly of technical specialists to give advice and answer questions the CAC might have.

Everyone is welcome, including the general public, students, elected officials, anyone with interest.
